Eastern Mediterranean cruise: Italy, Croatia, Montenegro, Greece. Explore towns nestled against the Adriatic Sea. Enjoy natural beauty, ancient history, frescoes, and mosaics. Will you swim off a catamaran in Croatia or wander sumptuous palaces?

Excursions copy: Split (Croatia)

Walk back in time: Salona and Trogrir

Walk amongst Roman ruins and envision what life was like in the years of the Common Era. Would you have watched gladiators battle beasts in the coliseum? Salona's remains are located within Solin, 6 km north of Split. After seeing Salona, you'll head to Trogrir, a city that's been described as medieval, Roman, and Hellenistic. Adjectives aside, little has changed in this ancient town (except the inhabitants' clothing).

Overland tour to Medjugorjie

Climb Apparition Hill. Join pilgrims who flock to to see Our Lady, first encountered by several children in the visionary Dragicevic family. If you like, you can attend Mass. Later, you'll get settled in a hotel and enjoy some free time to eat dinner and explore the town. After an early breakfast the next day, you'll take a scenic drive to catch the ship in Kotor.

Cruise the Croatian Islands by Catamaran

Swim. Sail. Feel water on your skin and wind in your hair. Explore the coasts of Šolta and Čiovo Island, then dive into the blue waters of Slatine Bay. Finally, you'll visit Split's Marjan Park and its numerous beaches. You'll also get a chance to explore the Riva promenade in the Old Town section of Split.

Kotor (Montenegro)

Walking tour through Kotor

Walk through a city where even the locals get lost. Your steps will be guided along winding, mazelike streets, where you'll visit St. Tryphon's Cathedral, a structure that dates from the 12th century. The Maritime Museum is also included in the tour. Before the day is done you'll get a chance to stroll the streets on your own and shop for souvenirs.

Boat tour through the Fjord to Perast Palace (FLOAT THROUGH THE FJORD TO PERAST PALACE.)

Feel tiny as your boat moves below Mt. Lovćen and Mt. Orjen, towering protectors of the Bay of Kotor. You'll stop at the islet of St. George and walk inside the church before continuing to the islet Our Lady of the Rock. The last place on your tour is Perast, a town whose buildings were constructed during the 1600-1700s, a time of economic prosperity and Venetian influence. You'll wander within the solid stone walls of Bujovic palace, a waterfront edifice now renamed the Museum of Perast.
